Can be a STRESSFUL process for student and parent/guardian!




Ways to: Relieve PRESSURE and Counter STRESS

- Set <u>LONG- AND SHORT-TERM GOALS</u>— break the college process into smaller, more manageable tasks—can help prevent students from feeling overwhelmed.
- **BE OPEN** to more than one college
- DON'T MAKE college admissions a <u>CONSTANT TOPIC</u> of conversation
- KEEP THINGS IN PERSPECTIVE- likely <u>not</u> the most important decision you will ever make. It might be <u>one</u> of the more important decisions you've made so far.

SAT & ACT TESTS

- Most colleges accept either test.
- These tests may be required for admissions to 4-year colleges, it is <u>important that you</u> check with each college for their testing requirements.
- Many colleges have adapted a test-optional policy...
- We recommend students take both SAT & ACT at least once by the end of their junior year.
- Students receiving free/reduced lunch qualify for fee waivers. Email <u>rebecca.england@cobbk12.org</u> to request a waiver.







OTHER TESTS YOU MAY NEED

- Accuplacer may be a required placement exam for 2-year and technical colleges (schedule to take this test at chosen college if required for admission purposes)
- ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Armed Battery) - aptitude/career exam required for entrance into the military that determines your eligibility for military jobs.
 - The ASVAB will be given at Walton on Wednesday, November 30 during WEB.

HOPE REQUIREMENTS

HOPE SCHOLARSHIP - FOR PUBLIC COLLEGES/UNIVERSITIES WITHIN GA

- 3.0 GPA in core academic courses: English, Math, Science, Soc Studies, & World Lang
- Honors courses are not weighted; AP/DE courses receive .5 extra quality pts up to 4.0
- This will qualify students for about 80% of tuition.
- The Class of 2024 is required to have <u>FOUR RIGOROUS COURSES</u> to be eligible for the HOPE and/or Zell Miller Scholarships.
 - Examples: Algebra II, Chemistry, Level 2 and higher of World Languages, core AP/Dual Enrollment

HOPE REQUIREMENTS

Zell Miller Scholarship

- 3.7 GPA for academic courses
- 1200 on SAT or 26 on ACT (1 sitting)
- Meet rigor requirements
- Covers full tuition



HOPE Grant –Technical College ONLY

- Best kept secret! Covers about 80% of tuition
- No minimum GPA from high school
- Diploma or technical certificate of credit
- HOPE Career Grant in certain industries

DUAL ENROLLMENT



- Georgia's Dual Enrollment program allows high school students (10th 12th grade) to earn college credit while working on their high school diploma.
- The Dual Enrollment program covers tuition, mandatory fees and required textbooks.
- The goal of Dual Enrollment is to increase college access and completion and prepare students to enter the workforce with the skills they need to succeed.

English	4 units of English Language Arts required for all students including 1 unit of 9th Literature/Composition and 1 unit of American Literature
Mathematics	4 units of Mathematics required for all students

Graduation Requirements vs. College Admissions Requirements

- They are not the same
- We work towards graduation requirements
- It is your responsibility to check each college's admission requirements to make sure you meet their requirements

Example

■ The State of Georgia requires no world language to graduate from high school. However, almost every 4-year college requires at least 2 years of the same world language (a very select few colleges may require 3 years).



INDIVIDUAL GRADUATION PLAN (IGP)

- No <u>Dual Enrollment</u> courses are listed in the IGP. Just register as if you will take all your classes at Walton.
- <u>Dramatic Writing</u> counts as both 1 English credit and 1 Fine Arts credit.
- AP Computer Science Principles can count as your 4th science credit. If you are currently taking AP Comp Sci Prin as a junior, you will have to add Part B under General Electives.
- All <u>Social Studies electives</u> (e.g., AP Psychology, Sociology, etc.) are found under <u>"General Electives"</u>
- If you are in **GSE Algebra 2**, register for **GSE Pre-Calculus** next year (even if you plan to take a different math class senior year).
- If you are in **Band**, **Chorus**, **Orchestra**, or **Weight Training**, you can add any of the sections into your IGP. Do not worry about the numbers next to these.
- You can't add <u>Minimum Day</u> to your IGP for your senior year. It's ok to have only 5 credits your senior year if you plan to take minimum day.
- Make sure all categories have a <u>check mark.</u>
- Do not log off the computer before checking out with the counselors in the media center.
