DUAL ENROLLMENT

DUAL ENROLLMENT (DE)

DE is a state funded program that allows 11th and 12th graders to take college classes while completing their high school diploma.

DE also provides limited options for 10th graders

DE pays for 100% tuition, mandatory fees, and required textbooks up to a maximum cap of 30 hours (*this equates to roughly one year of full-time college enrollment or around 10 courses*)

Any 10th grader can take CTAE classes at a Technical College

10th graders who have earned a 1200 SAT or 26 ACT (in one sitting) are eligible to apply to any DE program

To make an appointment with your counselor:

- ❖ Send an email request
- ❖ In emergency – check in first with your teacher, then request a pass to the counseling suite.
- ❖ IF your counselor is not available, we will make sure you see another counselor.

CONFIDENTIALITY/SAFETY

Confidentiality

Typically, what is said with your counselor will stay with your counselor.

Some **exceptions** include:

- ✓ imminent **danger** to self or others
- ✓ suspicion of **abuse** or neglect of children or the elderly

Crisis/Safety

If you are worried about a friend/peer, notify a counselor immediately.
(ex. suicide, alcohol, drugs, abuse, etc.)

If you see/hear something suspicious, report it to an adult.

COBB COUNTY DUAL ENROLLMENT DEADLINES
Walton sets internal priority deadlines that are **EARLIER** than the college application deadlines. College course registration often begins **before** the college deadlines so applying earlier provides a better chance of getting desired courses.
**Disclaimer: We cannot guarantee acceptances within a specific timeframe, nor desired times or locations of DE classes.*

The Cobb County Deadline is:
Fall and Summer: May 1st
Spring: November 1st

If the college DE deadline is earlier than May 1st, we strongly recommend completing the process AT LEAST ONE MONTH PRIOR to the college deadline.

Dual Enrollment, by its nature, places much responsibility on the student. Therefore, it is the **student's** responsibility to ensure that **all steps** are followed accurately and on time. Please check off steps as they are completed.

- BOTH student and parent: **Attend a Walton Dual Enrollment (DE) Information session.** This is **mandatory** for all interested in DE.
- It is the student's responsibility to **research college requirements** both for DE admissions and college admissions, impact to GPA/HOPE, impact on rigor as viewed by colleges, day-to-day logistics, course transferability, etc.
- Take the SAT/ACT/Accuplacer and submit scores** (and any desired AP scores) to the college(s) of your choice.

 - Send AP scores to exempt intro courses

We will discuss graduation requirements, desired DE classes, complete the DE Advisement Form and CCSD Local School Agreement, and more.

Scholarship

- 3.0 core GPA as calculated by GSFC (can be earned in college)
- **Must earn a minimum of 4 credits from the academic rigor course list prior to graduating from high school. (Review your HOPE transcript on GAfutures.org)**
- Two-year or four-year degree
- Must graduate from a GA high school
- Must be a GA resident for at least one year (Green Card or citizenship)
- Covers a **percentage** of tuition

Grant

- No initial GPA requirement
- Technical certificate or diploma
- Must have a high school diploma or GED
- Must be a GA resident for at least one year (Green Card or citizenship)
- Covers a **percentage** of tuition

ZELL MILLER

4-YEAR COLLEGE TECHNICAL COLLEGE

Zell Miller Scholarship

- Requires 3.7 core high school (HOPE) GPA as calculated by GSFC
- Requires 1200 SAT Math and Reading or 26 ACT composite
- **Must earn a minimum of 4 credits from the academic rigor course list prior to graduating from high school.**
- Pays for two-year or four-year degree
- Must graduate from a GA high school
- Must be GA resident for at least one year (Green Card or citizenship)
- Covers **FULL** tuition
- Applies automatically for Valedictorian or Salutatorian
- Must maintain 3.3 GPA while in college

Zell Miller Grant

- Requires 3.5 *college* GPA for grant eligibility
- Does not require minimum test score
- Pays for certificate or diploma
- Must graduate from a GA high school
- Must be GA Resident for at least one year (Green Card or citizenship)
- Covers **FULL** tuition (retroactively covers previous semester once 3.5 GPA is earned)
- Must maintain 3.5 GPA while in college
