



## BUILDING A COLLEGE LIST

"Reach schools" are those where your academic credentials fall below the school's range for the freshman class.

"Match schools" are schools where your academic credentials fall within or perhaps slightly exceed the school's range for the freshman class.

"Likely schools" are schools you will almost definitely get into because your academic credentials are much better than the typical range for their freshman class.

#### **REACH SCHOOLS**

Apply to 1 or 2

#### **MATCH SCHOOLS**

Apply to 2 or 3

#### **SAFETY SCHOOLS**

Apply to at least 1

### Points to Consider

- Check Admission Requirements
- Most colleges only consider academic classes when calculating GPAs
- Colleges want students who show an interest in their school, community, or family responsibilities
- Weighted and unweighted GPAs will be reported on the transcript
- Class rank will not be included on transcripts or reported on secondary reports

### Apply to College

- Complete and submit your applications as directed by the college.
- If a college has several application options, choose the one that streamlines the process for you!
  - ▶ No preference is given to one application over the other
  - Many Georgia colleges will direct you to the <u>GAFutures</u> website; you must set up an account before you can complete an application
- ▶ Take your time completing your application and essays this is a very important step!
- Continue to monitor your application status after you have applied.

# Understanding Application Types

- ► Early Decision (I &II): Binding
  - ► Can only apply Early Decision to one college
- Early Action: Non-Binding
  - ▶ Can apply early to other colleges, can apply regular decision
- Single Choice/Restricted Early Action: Non-Binding
  - Restricts early applications to some colleges; check college website for restrictions
- ► Rolling Admission
  - ▶ Open admission, no specific deadline
- Regular Decision
  - Deadline date established by the institution
- Priority Deadline
  - Often used for scholarship consideration

# Impacts of COVID-19 on College Admissions

- Standardized Testing
  - ▶ Test Optional What does this mean for you?
  - ▶ University System of Georgia Schools require SAT/ACT Score
- College Visits
  - ► Check the college websites for On Campus Tours/Virtual Opportunities
- Focus on what you have done, not on missed opportunities.
- COVID-19 Essay Question
  - ► COVID-19 has affected students in dramatically different ways. If you need it, the COVID-19 and natural disaster question in the Additional Information section is a place for you to describe the impact of these events. The question is not intended to be an extra essay. There's also no need to describe how your school responded to these events.

# Information for College Applications

- ► Class Size of the Class of 2022: 672 Students
- Cobb County school district does not rank students.
- Our grading scale is a weighted 4.0 scale.
- Waive your rights when requesting recommendations!

# Two -year college options can include:

- Core academic classes that are prerequisites for a traditional four-year college degree program
- General coursework and practical hands-on training to provide a concentrated curriculum in a specific career field
- Examples: Georgia State University Perimeter and Chattahoochee Technical College

# Two-Year Colleges & Technical Colleges

► See if the SAT/ACT is required- may take the Accuplacer Exam instead- check with each individual school

► Two-year school requirements - 2.0 GPA, 2 World Languages plus all Georgia graduation requirements

### Military/Armed Forces

#### Military Enlistment

- High school diploma is required
- Take the ASVAB
- Make contact with branch recruiter
- Request your transcript in May

#### Service Academies

- Highly selective
- Require endorsement by a member of Congress or Senate

#### ► ROTC Scholarship Programs

- On-campus for college classes, training/service requirements on campus and off-campus on some weekends and breaks
- Service requirement after graduation


### Logging into Naviance

  - o Click on the diploma icon at the top right of the Walton homepage




- If you're on a CCSD computer, then you will be automatically logged into Naviance.

## Naviance Student Homepage


College Application Process Using Naviance eDocs

#### Step 1 of Common App Matching: Creating CA Account & Signing the FERPA Release Waiver

Students should follow the steps in <u>this video</u> to learn how to setup their Common App account & how to sign the FERPA Release Waiver




We recommend you waive your FERPA rights! Colleges may question the validity of your recommendation letters if you do not waive your rights. In addition, your teachers and counselors may not feel comfortable writing a letter of recommendation without waiving your rights.

## Step 2 of Common App Matching: Matching the CA Account in Naviance


- 1. Log into **Naviance**
- 2. Go to Colleges I'm Applying To
- 3. Select the hot pink bar to **Match Accounts**
- 4. Enter the **email address** used for the Common App account
- 5. Confirm that the **birthdate** is correct
- 6. Select Match Accounts
- 7. Once students have matched their account, schools from their application list in Common App will feed into their Colleges I'm Applying To list in Naviance

## How to Add Colleges to the "Colleges I'm Applying to" list


- This is the section where students will spend most of their time.
- You must complete this section in order to request letters of recommendation and transcripts.
- You must also designate the application type within this section.



#### Teacher Recommendations

- Allow <u>at least 3-4 weeks</u> for teachers to complete their recommendation portion of your application!
- ▶ It is your responsibility to research which schools require a letter of recommendation on their website.
  - ▶ If they do not ask for a letter of recommendation, they do not use it in the admissions process. DO NOT ASK YOUR TEACHER FOR ONE IF THIS IS THE CASE!
- ▶ Students "invite" their teachers to upload and send letters of recommendation in two steps:
  - 1. Provide teachers with a copy of your "TEACHER RECOMMENDATION INFORMATION FORM" found in the Recommendation Packet and include on the form the deadline date of your first application that requires their letter of recommendation.
  - 2. Request Letters of Recommendation in Naviance (make sure your college has been added to the "Colleges I'm Applying To" tab)


#### **Requesting LORs**

- 1. Go to Colleges I'm Applying To
- 2. Scroll down and Select Letters of Recommendation Section
- 3. Select **Add Request**
- 4. Select a **Teacher**
- Select which colleges the request is for
- 6. Include a **personal note**
- 7. Select **Submit Request**
- 8. Select Request and Finish

## Track Submission Status of Recommendation Letters in Naviance

#### **Tracking LOR Status**

- Go to Colleges I'm Applying
   To List
- Select Letters of Recommendation at the bottom of the list
- 3. Check the Status column to review when a teacher has submitted a LOR



# Requesting Transcripts: 2-Step Process

- 1. Add college you are applying to Naviance.
  - Log onto your Naviance student account.
  - Select the COLLEGES tab.
  - Under COLLEGES select "Colleges I'm Applying To"
  - Click on "+", add each college/university, including application information
  - Click "Add Application"
- 2. Come to the Records Room and sign your transcript card. Transcript fee is \$2.00 per transcript.
  - For Common Application documents, you MUST link your Common App account to your Naviance account.
  - Please bring exact dollar amount or check made out to Walton High School.
  - It is your responsibility to complete ALL parts of the above process, or transcripts will not be sent.

We will begin accepting transcript requests on Monday, August 16, 2021

## Counselor Recommendations/ Secondary School Reports

- Allow <u>at least 3-4 weeks</u> for your counselor to complete her recommendation portion of your application!
- Counselors must have a completed recommendation packet in order to write a letter of recommendation.
  - YOUR ENGLISH TEACHER WILL NOT BE PROVIDING YOUR COUNSELOR WITH A COPY!
- Click here to access the counselor recommendation packet on the School Counseling (if you did not complete yours over the summer). Email a copy to your counselor 3-4 weeks before your deadline.

### Send SAT/ACT Test Scores

SAT/ACT scores must be sent directly from the testing agencies websites.

## College Visits

Each year over 100 college admissions counselors come to Walton to present information about academic and special programs, admission requirements, and campus life.


- ▶ This fall, college visits will be face-to-face.
- College visits are open to Walton junior and senior students (only).
- Students must sign up in Naviance at least 12 hours in advance.
- ▶ Print Naviance confirmation email to show your teacher before coming to visit.
- ▶ When attending college visits:
  - ▶ Be prepared and ask thoughtful questions.
  - ▶ This is your opportunity to make a good first impression and show that you are interested in that college or university.



## College Visits

#### To register for a college visit:

- The College Visit link is located in the "What's New" section at the bottom right side of the Colleges homepage
- Click on "More Info"
- Click on "Register"
- You will receive an email the day before your visit as confirmation. Print this as your pass.
- Check Naviance frequently for upcoming college visits
- You must sign up through your Naviance account at least 12 hours in advance.

### Steps to Financial Aid: FAFSA

- Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
- Submitted annually by college students to determine eligibility for student financial aid
- Includes sections to be completed by the student and parent/guardian
- ► FAFSA goes live October 1, 2021
- Go to: <u>FAFSA website</u>
- Look for the "Net Price Calculator" on the college website to determine the Estimated Family Contribution (EFC) -- the estimated amount you will have to pay to attend that institution

# Steps to Institutional Aid: CSS Profile

- Many private colleges require the CSS Profile in addition to the FAFSA.
- Used by many Early Action/Early Decision Institutions
- CSS Profile is available October 1, 2021
  - ▶ \$25 Original Application Fee/One College
  - ▶ \$16 for additional college/program
  - ▶ Students eligible for SAT fee waiver may receive a CSS fee waiver

### HOPE Scholarship

- ▶ HOPE Scholarship:
  - 3.0 GPA for academic courses: Language Arts, Social Studies, Math, Science, and World Language.
    - ▶ A part of your college tuition will be covered, this amount will vary.
- Zell Miller Scholarship:
  - ▶ 3.7 GPA for academic courses, 1200 on SAT (Reading and Math, 1 sitting), or 26 on the ACT, 1 sitting.
    - All of tuition will be covered.

The Class of 2021 is required to have four rigorous courses to be eligible for the HOPE and/or Zell Miller Scholarship. Check <u>www.GAFutures.org</u> for a list of rigorous courses and other eligibility criteria.

#### HOPE Grant

- ► The HOPE Grant Program is for students seeking a technical certificate or diploma, regardless of the student's high school grade point average or graduation date.
- ► The HOPE Grant Award amount will cover a portion of a student's tuition.
- ► Full-time enrollment is not required.
- Students are required to have a postsecondary cumulative 2.0 GPA in order to maintain eligibility.

## Scholarships

- ▶ Types of Scholarships:
  - ▶ Merit, Athletic, Organizational
- Check the Scholarship Resources in Naviance by clicking "Colleges" and then underneath "Scholarships and Money" selecting "Scholarship List"
- Search for scholarships under either "College-Specific Scholarships" or "Local & Regional Scholarships" \_\_\_\_\_\_ (this is where Walton updates its scholarships)
- You can also select "National Scholarship Search" found under "Scholarships & Money" to search for national scholarships
- ► Check the college websites and online search engines
- ► Email Mrs. Gross if you are interested in applying for any of the announced scholarships or if you are interested in a scholarship in which you must be nominated by Walton.

### Volunteer Service Recognition-Graduation Honor Cord


- ▶ Students need 150 hours of verified & approved service hours


